Programmes

1. Read! Fest 2023

Started in 2014, Read! Fest is NLB's signature event to encourage adult Singaporeans to read in English and their Mother Tongues. The 2023 theme was "Flourish", and explored living amid rapid change, and society's efforts in building and supporting ground-up communities.

2. Spark!Lab™

Spark!Lab[™] at Punggol Regional Library is a tinkering space that NLB set up in partnership with the Smithsonian Institution from the United States of America. Spark!Lab[™] aims to pique children's curiosity, and to develop 21st century skills through these experiences.

3. "Let's Be S.U.R.E Together!" Festival

"Let's be S.U.R.E together!" explored themes such as the impact of generative A.I., through the use of NLB's information literacy framework S.U.R.E. (Source, Understand, Research, Evaluate). The series of events at the Festival equipped the public with tools to make informed decisions in an interconnected world and to form good online habits.

Exhibitions

1. Law of the Land at the National Gallery of Singapore

Law of the Land: Highlights of Singapore's Constitutional Documents features rare material from key moments in the nation's constitutional history. The items featured are from the collections of the National Archives of Singapore and National Library.

2. Punggol Stories

The first exhibition at Punggol Regional Library features stories and the rich tapestry of Punggol's history, including when it was home to kampongs, pig farms and a thriving seafood scene.

3. To Draw an Idea: Retracing the Designs of William Lim Associates – W Architects

Following the design evolution of William Lim Associates – W Architects through 19 projects over its 40-year history, this exhibition invites visitors to explore the firm's designs in the context of key events and movements in Singapore's recent architectural history.
