

<p>Key Highlights</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>● <b>Entrance</b> The entrance lobby is designed to be an uncluttered space with a prominent atrium design that welcomes people into the Virtual Library, a first of its kind, community space for users to read and learn digitally.</li></ul>  <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>● <b>Digital Learning Zone</b> The Digital Learning Zone, featuring an extensive selection of the National Library Board's (NLB) digital collection, for users to enjoy easy access and seamless browsing of digital content, to learn as a community. It is the first in the public library network to house a dedicated Digital Learning Zone for users to access a large selection of digital content.</li></ul>



- **Children’s Zone**

This area comprises child-friendly furniture and seating spaces designed for families to sit and read together. The catalogue station is placed at a suitable height to provide easy access for our young users to conduct searches for library materials. The Children’s Zone has age-customised collections such as an Early Literacy section for users aged up to six years, with front-facing displays. Another highlight of the Children’s Zone is the Story Circle, a dedicated storytelling space where children can enjoy engaging storytelling sessions by librarians and volunteers with the use of an interactive projector.



**Collection Highlights**

- **Early Literacy Collection**

The Early Literacy Collections are shelved on low shelves, and are grouped into 5 categories: “Sense & Sensation”, “Concepts”, “Languages”, “Poetry & Rhymes” and “Emergent Reader” to help parents and caregivers select materials to support their child’s development.

- **Adults and Young People**

The Adult and Young People’s Collection consist of fiction books from various genres in the four official languages. In addition, there are also non-fiction titles on Health, Business, Cookery, Computers, among other subjects.

Library History	<p>Originally located at the Sembawang Town Council building in Yishun Street 22. Yishun Public Library was officially opened on 26 February 1998 by Associate Professor Ho Peng Kee, Minister of State for Law &amp; Home Affairs, Member of Parliament for Sembawang GRC.</p> <p>The library relocated to Level 4, Northpoint Shopping Centre, and was re-opened on 14 November 2008 by Mr Khaw Boon Wan, then Minister for Health and MP of Sembawang GRC.</p> <p>In 2017, Northpoint Shopping Centre, which the library was located in, underwent major redevelopment works. The library closed down during this period to renovate and upgrade the library spaces and facilities to better serve users and the Yishun community.</p>
Interesting Facts	<p>The interiors of the library are inspired by Yishun's natural plantation heritage and transformation, to a bustling estate. The whole library is connected through one main circulation pathway. The main pathway will be mirrored with a ceiling light panel that leads into the different sections of the Library, keeping the whole library connected. The library has also adopted the design experience of a 'Time-Out' from other aspects of life, which is encapsulated at the Quiet Reading Lounge, where users can spend time in the cosy individual nooks for reflections and contemplative reading.</p>
