8		Master Plan of the Nanpo Operation c.1910s Donated by Lim Shao Bin	This master plan of the Nanpo Operation marked as secret is part of a selection of documents showing the Japanese Army's land acquisition activities in the Riau islands and Singapore in the 1910s. These covert activities were connected to 'Operation Nanpo', a Japanese expansionist plan carried out in Southeast Asia under the direction of Major General Utsunomiya Tarō.  These documents suggest that the Japanese Army staff already had a vision to expand its colonies into Southeast Asia as early as the beginning of the twentieth century.
