On Paper: Singapore Before 1867 exhibition tour Currently running till March 2020 More than 100 materials from the National Library and National Archives of Singapore, and over 50 materials from overseas institutions will be showcased – many on public display for the first time. Visitors can see the earliest known landward map – the Bute Map – of Singapore, which documents remnants of ancient Singapore, including Sultan Husain's palace, located in Kampong Glam with a large Bugis town. This map and other materials trace the history of Singapore from as early as the 17 th century to 1867, when the Straits Settlements became a British Crown Colony with Singapore as its capital.	l I
2.	Rare Gallery tour On display now at the Rare Gallery are early European accounts of Southeast Asia, a theme that was selected as Singapore was chair of ASEAN in 2018. Displays are curated thematically and changed every six months. The Rare Materials collection, which comprises over 16,000 items, is a source of valuable research materials on Singapore and Southeast Asia. It is housed at level 13 of the National Library Building in a climate-controlled environment.
