Land Title Deeds Related to the Thian Hock Keng Temple dating from 1828 These primary documents relate to the beginnings of the Thian Hock Keng Temple. Located at Telok Ayer Street, the temple housed the clan's office. Details of the temple's history were engraved on the stone steles inside the Entrance Hall. The title deeds captured the land transactions of different plots of land purchased by prominent businessmen like Tan Tock Seng for the construction of the temple. Land title deed (No. 593) bears the signature of Mr Tan

He acquired several land parcels in Telok Ayer street in 1838 to form a large piece of land for the Tian Hock Keng Temple building which completed construction in 1840. The document also contained two interesting red seals – one of which was the "United Company" wax seal, which was known as the British East India Company after 1873 which owned the land; and of the "Singapore Residency" ink seal, which is an endorsement by the Resident of Singapore acting on behalf of United Company.

This was evident in the use of black and red ink to note the two different currencies when Singapore was under the Japanese and British rule respectively.
