Geomancer (UK, 2017, Lawrence Lek, PG)

Multi-disciplinary artist, filmmaker and musician Lawrence Lek uses game software, 3D animation, computer-generated imagery and interactive software to create his two films, Geomancer and AIDOL, which will be screened in succession.

The year is 2065. Singapore is preparing to celebrate its Centennial. In the stratosphere above, a satellite artificial intelligence faces imminent demise. It escapes to Earth to establish its own autonomy and to fulfil its dream of becoming the first AI artist. Faced with a world that limits its freedom, Geomancer must come to terms with its militarised origins, a search that begins with a mysterious syndicate known as the Sinofuturists.

Geomancer uses 'art' to symbolise humanity's appreciation for creative thought and beauty. How would humans feel if an emotionally aware AI gains the power of self-expression and creative genius is no longer the domain of humanity?

In AIDOL, Lek's first feature length film and sequel to Geomancer, the eSports Olympic finale is set to take place. Diva, a washed-up popstar, is set to mount a comeback with the help of the AI composer Geomancer. Geomancer dreams of being recognised as an artist, while Diva dreams of fame.

AIDOL explores the complex relationship between humanity and artificial intelligence, as well as the allure and the emptiness of fame.

In this experimental documentary, hybrid footage from the narrator's mundane everyday experience, fragments of news such as the moon landing, and professionally shot photographs of landscapes are juxtaposed to create an honest depiction of humanity. An (imaginary) alien friend is the framing device that serves as the receiver of the documentary's narrative. A self-reflection of the narrator's personal life including anecdotes from his friends and family, the film conveys the most personal and most universal, capturing Filipino culture at its most distinct and authentic.
