

4	Discovery Sculptures at Waterway Point	Discovery Sculptures	Covering the themes of biodiversity, gardening and wellness, and efforts in climate emergency, these life-sized sculptures take the form of animals and nature elements. Sculptures that visitors can look forward to include a dinosaur, a crab and a mushroom house. Each sculpture has a unique QR code where visitors can scan to view curated eReads. Visitors can also take selfies with these colourful monuments to share over social media.
5		Carousel Cityscapes	Visitors will be transported to different parts of the world through a fully-immersive audio-visual experience at the carousel. The quick journey-around-the-world will first time travel back to Singapore in the past, then pull visitors back to present-day Singapore, before travelling to Paris, Switzerland, Japan and Korea. Visitors can continue their travel journey by scanning QR codes at an information stand by the carousel to access effects related to each city.

The Singapore Storytellers door allows visitors to create a short audio-story using soundbites uploaded by fellow Singaporeans as part of the National Archives of Singapore's Soundscape project, Visitors can select soundbites and put them together to form an audiostory, then scan the QR on the screen to save the audiostory to their phone. Being an Equaliser Gamers will appreciate the Equaliser door, made to look like something out of an 8-bit game. Through the door, visitors will enter the NLB world and follow a young boy as he journeys across the island. Along the way, he uses tools from NLB to bridge the physical and digital divides in society.
