Fiction	Adult	Thrawn: Ascendancy: Greater Good by Timothy Zahn  <p>After leading the Chiss to victory and bringing glory to the House of Mitth, Thrawn and the Expansionary Defense Fleet must now face a new kind of threat, one that could tear the Nine Ruling Families and the Forty Great Houses apart, breaking very foundation of the Ascendancy itself.</p>
	Teen	The High Republic: The Path of Vengeance by Cavan Scott  <p>Two cousins from the Path of the Open Hand, a group that believes the Force should not be used by anyone, take different paths: Marda searches for creatures to use against the Jedi, while Yana forms an alliance with the father of her dead lover and tries to overthrow their leader, the Mother.</p>

		 <p>Teenage Obi-Wan grows tired of his slow Jedi training. When his teacher Qui-Gon vanishes, he takes on a mission alone to a mysterious planet and encounters a group of teens who wield the Force freely. Though tempted by their way of life, Obi-Wan feels something's wrong on their planet.</p>
	Junior	<p>The High Republic: A Test of Courage by Justina Ireland, illustrated by Petur Antonsson</p>  <p>Young Jedi Vernestra Rwoh's mission takes a sharp turn when a bomb forces her and a small group to crash-land on a remote moon. Stranded and cut off, they soon discover they're not alone.</p>
	Junior	<p>The Padawan Cookbook: Kid-friendly recipes from a galaxy far, far away by Jenn Fujikawa and Liz Lee Heinecke</p>  <p>A Star Wars-themed cookbook designed for young chefs, featuring child-friendly recipes inspired by the galaxy far, far away. This illustrated guide helps children learn basic cooking</p>

		skills while preparing dishes inspired by the Star Wars universe.
Early literacy (aged 4-6)	Jedi Training by Caitlin Kennedy 	Join Kai Brightstar and his two friends Lys and Nubs as they train to be Jedi Knights on the planet Tenoo, mastering the Force.
Early literacy (aged 4-6)	The High Republic: Jedi Brave in Every Way by Rosemary and Charles Soule, illustrated by Valerie Valdivia 	Set in the era of the High Republic, wise Master Yoda teams up with Burryaga, a young Wookiee Jedi, to teach students about bravery. Through their stories, children can learn how to overcome their fears and become stronger.
Early literacy (aged 0-3)	The Empire Strikes Back by Lucasfilm, illustrated by Al Williamson 	A retelling of 'The Empire Strikes Back', the story follows the Rebels fighting the Empire on the frozen planet Hoth, Luke Skywalker training with Yoda to become a Jedi, and a surprising revelation waiting for them in Cloud City
Early literacy (aged 0-3)	Star Wars Epic Yarns: Return of the Jedi by Jack and Holman Wang	

		 <p>Using handcrafted felt puppets, the authors recreate, in staged scenes and twelve words, the final chapter of the original trilogy, as Luke and Leia rescue Han, the rebel forces attack the second Death Star, and Luke confronts his heritage.</p>
Comics/ Graphic Novels	Adult	<p>From the Journals of Obi-Wan Kenobi by Jason Aaron and Dash Aaron</p>  <p>Exiled on Tatooine, Obi-Wan must choose between secretly protecting Luke Skywalker or helping local farmers fight against criminals. His actions catch Jabba the Hutt's attention, and Obi-Wan ends up facing the galaxy's deadliest Wookiee, Black Krrsantan.</p>
	Adult	<p>Star Wars: Scoundrels, Rebels and the Empire by Marc Guggenheim and others</p>

		 <p>A collection of stories from across the Star Wars galaxy: Jabba the Hutt faces a secret plot against him, Ewoks share their stories on Endor, and Lando Calrissian teams up with Chewbacca for a dangerous mission, and many others.</p>	
	Adult	Star Wars: Darth Vader – Vader by Kieron Gillen  <p>After the Death Star's destruction, this story follows Darth Vader as he hunts down the Rebels and uncovers the Emperor's secrets. Along the way, he meets Aphra, a weapons hunter, and builds a droid army on Geonosis. While Vader searches for answers, powerful figures try to keep him in the dark. The story features familiar faces like Jabba the Hutt and Boba Fett.</p>	
	Adult	Star Wars: Darth Vader – Dark Lord of the Sith series (Vol. 1 to 4) by Charles Soule	

		 <p>The story takes place right after 'Revenge of the Sith,' when the Empire rules the galaxy. It follows Darth Vader and his group of dark Force wielders called the Inquisitors.</p>
	Adult	<p>The Mandalorian: The Manga series (Vol. 1 & 2) adapted by Yusuke Osawa, translated by Caleb Cook</p>  <p>A bounty hunter called the Mandalorian is hired to capture and return the Child to the Imperial Remnant. Instead of turning the Child in, he decides to protect him from the Empire, putting both their lives in danger.</p>
