

### EDUCATOR'S RESOURCE (Suitable for N1-N2) Title: Izzy Paints

#### Pre-Reading Activity: RAINBOW COLOURS

This activity helps to reinforce colour recognition and listening skills.

Rainbow Colours Song by Jbrary\* (Tune: Twinkle, Twinkle, Little Star)



#### Lyrics:

First comes red and orange too, Shiny yellow, green, and blue, Purple ends the pretty rays, Only seen on rainy days. First comes red and orange too, Shiny yellow, green, and blue.

#### **Materials Needed:**

- One coloured paper in various colours (red, orange, yellow, green, blue, purple) for each child
- Marker (for teachers)



#### Instructions:

• Spell and write the colour on each coloured paper clearly. For example, write "Green" on a green paper.



- Have the children sit in a circle and distribute one coloured paper to each child.
- As you sing each line, have the children hold up the corresponding coloured paper.
  - For example, for "First comes red and orange too," hold up the red and orange papers.
  - Continue this process with the rest of the colours.
- At the end of the song, you can review the colours by asking the children to name the colours of their papers.



### Read "Izzy Paints" with your children and explore the book with the talking points below:

- What do you like to use for drawing? Do you splash colours everywhere like Izzy does?
- What do you like to draw?
- Who would you like to show your art pieces to?
- How do you think Izzy uses her imagination to create beautiful art pieces?

#### Post-Reading Activity: **SPONGE PAINTING ADVENTURE**

This activity helps children develop fine motor skills and creativity through exploring patterns and designs.

#### **Materials Needed:**

- Sponges cut into different shapes (circles, squares, stars, etc.)
- Washable paint in assorted colours
- Drawing paper
- Paint trays or paper plates



#### Instructions:

- Introduce the concept of sponge painting to the children.
- Show the different sponge shapes and explain how they can be used to create patterns and designs.
- Demonstrate how to dip the sponges in paint and create patterns on the drawing paper. Show different techniques such as stamping, dragging or swirling the sponges.
- Distribute sponges, paint, and drawing paper to each child.
- Encourage the children to dip the sponges in paint and create their own unique patterns and designs on the drawing paper.
- Have the children share their artwork and describe their favourite part of the activity.



### EDUCATOR'S RESOURCE (Suitable for K1-K2) Title: I Am an Artist

#### Pre-Reading Activity: IF YOU'RE AN ARTIST

This activity helps children express themselves, and develop coordination and rhythm.

#### If You're an Artist and You Know It!

(Tune: If you're happy and you know it)

#### Lyrics:

If you're an artist and you know it, clap your hands,

If you're an artist and you know it, clap your hands,

If you're an artist and you know it, and you really want to show it,

If you're an artist and you know it, clap your hands.

Repeat with different lyrics, such as

stomp your feet wiggle your hips shout "I am!"





### Read "I Am an Artist" with your children and explore the book with the talking points below:

- What materials does the boy use to create art?
- How do you think the boy feels when he creates his art?
- How do you feel when you create art?
- What do you think the boy does when he runs out of art supplies?

#### Post-Reading Activity: RAINBOW MAGIC: EXPLORING COLOUR MIXING!

This activity introduces children to the primary colours and encourages hands-on exploration as they mix them to create secondary colours.

#### **Materials Needed:**

Red, blue, and yellow paints
 Paint trays or paper plates
 Paintbrushes
 Drawing paper

#### Instructions:

- · Introduce the concept of primary colours red, blue, and yellow to the children.
- Explain that these colours are the building blocks for all other colours and show examples of each primary colour.
- Introduce the concept of secondary colours. Demonstrate how to mix primary colours to create secondary colours:

Red + Yellow = Orange

Blue + Yellow = Green

Red + Blue = Purple

- Distribute paint trays or paper plates with blobs of red, blue, and yellow paint to each child.
- Get the children to mix the colours and observe the transformation into secondary colours.
- Encourage them to experiment by combining different colours and exploring their own creative colour combinations. For example, they can mix a primary and a secondary colour to create tertiary colours!
