Rumbold & Clark (2006) stated that at every stage of a child's development, the benefits of reading for pleasure are well documented. Reading is positively linked with a wide spectrum of skills required for the twenty-first century, such as:



Improved reading and writing ability



Better text comprehension and grammar



Expanded vocabulary



Extensive general knowledge



Better understanding of other cultures



Community participation



Greater insight into human nature and decision-making





READER TYPES

Every child is unique. Applying the appropriate strategy is key to making reading fun for them. Use the chart below to identify your child's reader type, as well as which strategy to adopt to enhance their reading experience.



GENERAL TIPS



Build phonological awareness

- Point out patterns such as words that rhyme or have the same starting sounds.
- Use a finger to follow along the words as you read.



Build general knowledge and verbal vocabulary

- Expand on the story by adding related information e.g. while reading a book about the North Pole, talk about some of the animals that live there.
- Reinforce ideas through real-life experiences e.g. visiting the zoo after reading about animals.



Create a positive reading environment

- Set aside time to read together regularly. Consistency is key.
- Avoid associating reading with punishment or other negative emotions. e.g. "If you don't finish this book, you can't use the computer."
- Support independent reading by using an encouraging tone.
 Jump in to help with difficult words if you see them struggling.



Manage your expectations based on your child's current ability

- Be mindful of reading fatigue. For beginner readers, we recommend picture books or short chapter books with simple sentences.
- Allow children to read what interests them, and at their own pace.



Be a reading role model

- · Spines are not marked with any icon
- Contain mostly text and very few, if any, illustrations that encourage a child's imagination

THE READING TREES 1: READING NOOK

Does a little library in your home filled with books, magazines, puzzles, and activity books sound enticing? Why not create a corner at home that supports independent reading and parent-child bonding?

Here are some tips you can adopt to make the reading nook a truly special place for your child to embark on reading adventures big and small!



1. Pick the perfect spot

Which area is the most accessible and welcoming for your child? Get them involved in the decision process, and consider how certain details can make it their favourite spot in the house for reading.



2. Ideal lighting

Good lighting will ensure that your child's eyes are well-cared-for. Set the reading nook next to a window for natural light to flow in, or use warm lighting to create a cozy environment.



3. Personalisation

Let them decorate the space with your guidance. By allowing your child to personalise it, they gain a sense of ownership over the area. If they like the way the reading nook looks, they are much more likely to use it.

A reading nook can be a special place for a child with a book and a big imagination.

THE READING TREES II: DIALOGIC READING AND WORDLESS PICTURE BOOKS

Having a conversation while reading with your child is also known as dialogic reading. It encourages different ways of thinking, sharpens the flow of logic in your child's mind, and trains their language skills.

How do you engage in dialogic reading with your child? You can try the PEER sequence, **Prompt, Evaluate, Expand and Repeat**:

- Prompt your child to say something about the book:
 What do you see on this page?
- **Evaluate** your child's response: Yes, it's a tree.
- Expand your child's response by rephrasing and adding information to it:
 It's a tree with heart-shaped leaves.
- Repeat the prompt to ensure your child has learnt from your expansion:
 Tell me again, what do you see on this page?

THE READING TREES III: STORY OF YOUR LIFE

Even the most hesitant readers can be encouraged to read through storytelling activities.

How to encourage storytelling at home:

Does your child like to illustrate or doodle? Even if some drawings look simple at first glance, they are meaningful for your child.

Use this simple guide to help your child realise their potential as creative storytellers.



1. Write the story down and draw it out

Putting pencil to paper helps children to think more deeply about the story they tell. They may also make small changes to fine-tune their story.



2. Read the story

Children are likely to get excited over the completion of their first story and would want to write more. You can encourage them to read widely so that they can refine their ideas.



3. Share the story

Let children tell their stories with family and friends. This allows them to have their ideas heard thus validating their efforts, and also acts as avenues for constructive feedback.

Are All Toy Review Videos Genuine? - Be S.U.R.E. About What You Watch

In today's digital age, it is easy for young children to gain access to online videos. What are some tips that you can share with your child to ascertain the video's credibility?

You and your child may have watched YouTube videos of toy reviews and unboxing videos. However, how can you be sure that these reviews are genuine, and not advertisements in disguise sponsored by toy companies?

There are often telltale signs if such videos are sponsored. It could be in the description or mentioned in the video itself. If nothing is mentioned, it is still best to adopt a healthy scepticism regarding the video's authenticity. In contrast, genuine reviewers would state clearly that they have purchased the toys and that the video is not sponsored.

If only positive things are said in the video, you should be wary. Do not be convinced by a child influencer appearing excited playing with or unboxing a new toy as that influencer could have been sponsored to act that way. A toy company may have intentionally engaged a child influencer to review their toys as it would seem more credible coming from a child of similar age.

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FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

As parents, you may have certain questions pertaining to your child's reading habits. These are some common concerns parents have raised over the years, and how you can approach them with your child.

- 1. How do I get my child to find time to read when he/she has so much schoolwork? Reading can take place in many ways, even during their day-to-day experiences. Encourage your child to read everything aloud e.g. food labels, maps, menus. Read with your child for at least 10 minutes every day.
- 2. My child dislikes reading and refuses to read. What should I do? Comics and magazines are great entry point into reading. Get your child to explore books inspired from movies or non-fiction titles on topics that interest them. Be encouraging when your child picks up a book and make time to read it together.
- 3. My child does not finish reading books because he/she gets bored easily. What should I do?

Consider interactive books such as augmented reality (AR) or game books where children can interact with the topic beyond the pages. Additionally, you can focus on genres or subjects that are typically more exciting. The science fiction genre and space-related topics tend to keep children hooked until the end.

4. My child only reads books from a particular series. What should I do? Encourage them to read out of their comfort zone by tapping on current events or their interests. Alternatively, you can look at the NLB catalogue for read-alikes.

5. What books should I borrow for my children?

You can start with picture books by popular authors such as Mo Willems, Julia Donaldson, Oliver Jeffers, Jon Klassen and Ruth Wan-Lau.

6. How do I encourage my child to read Mother Tongue Language books?

Check out translated books such as Paul Tobin's Plants Vs Zombies and Fric Litwin's Pete the Cat. Alternatively, you can borrow bilingual books which have both English and Mother Tongue on the same page. For example, the Little Dim Sum Warriors series (Chinese), the GPS Children's Book Series (Malay), and the iPatti series (Tamil) are bilingual titles.

- Jalan cerita yang mudah, diulang-ulang disertai gambar
- Buku sentuh-dan-rasa
- Buku yang disertakan soalan
- · Buku berunsur mainan

4 - 6 tahun

Perkembangan Bahasa

- Jangka tumpuan lebih lama
- Kosa kata lebih luas
- Menggunakan kala lampau dengan hetul
- Menceritakan sesuatu mengikut urutan
- Tahu memegang buku, membelek muka surat serta membaca dengan lantang

Buku yang Sesuai

- Jalan cerita yang lebih kompleks dan mempunyai perkembangan watak
- Cerita yang menonjolkan konsepkonsep asas dan emosi, cth: kemarahan, rasa sayang
- Buku maklumat, kisah pengembaraan, fantasi, cerita rakyat, fiksyen realistik kontemporari

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

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
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
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
