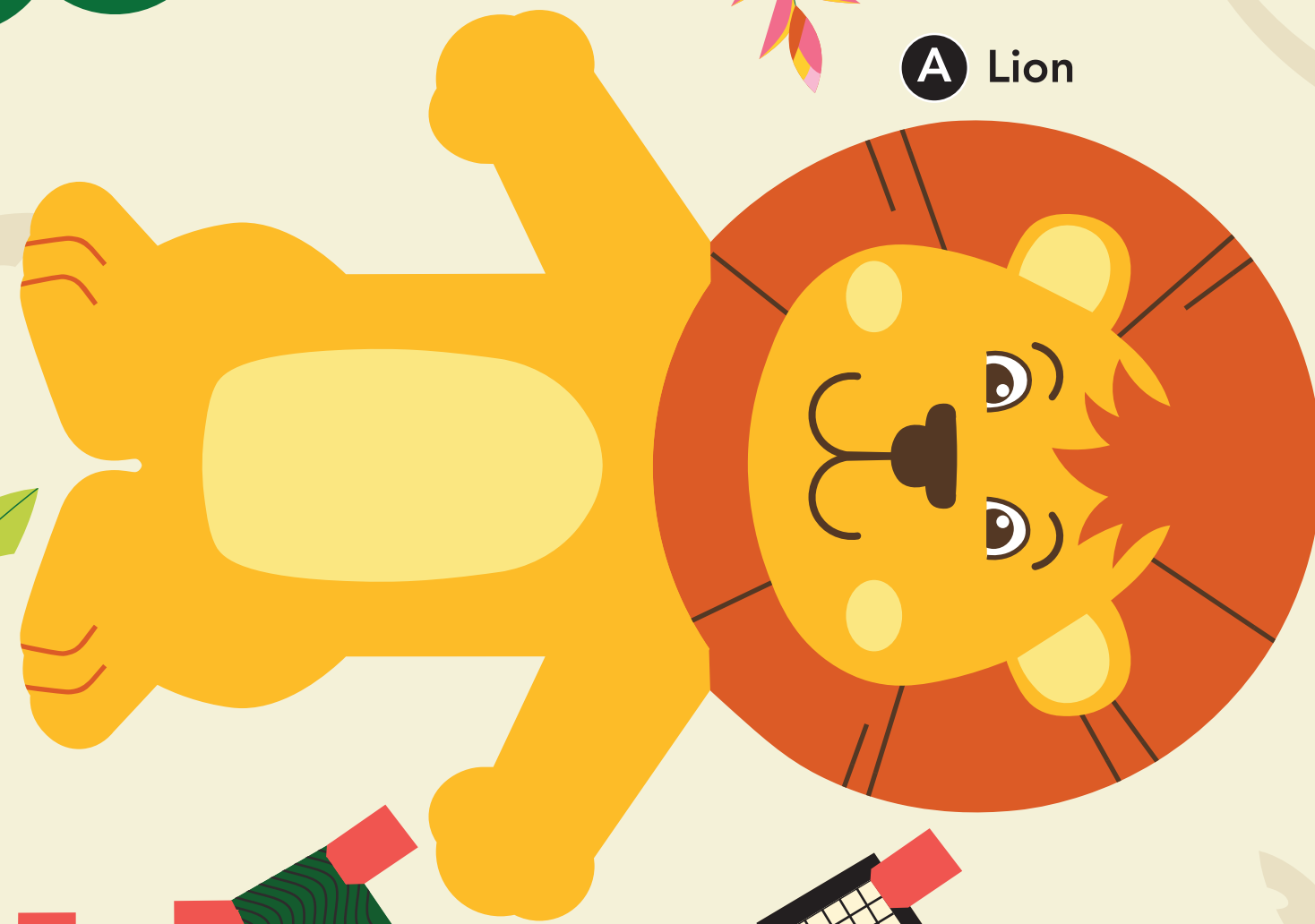
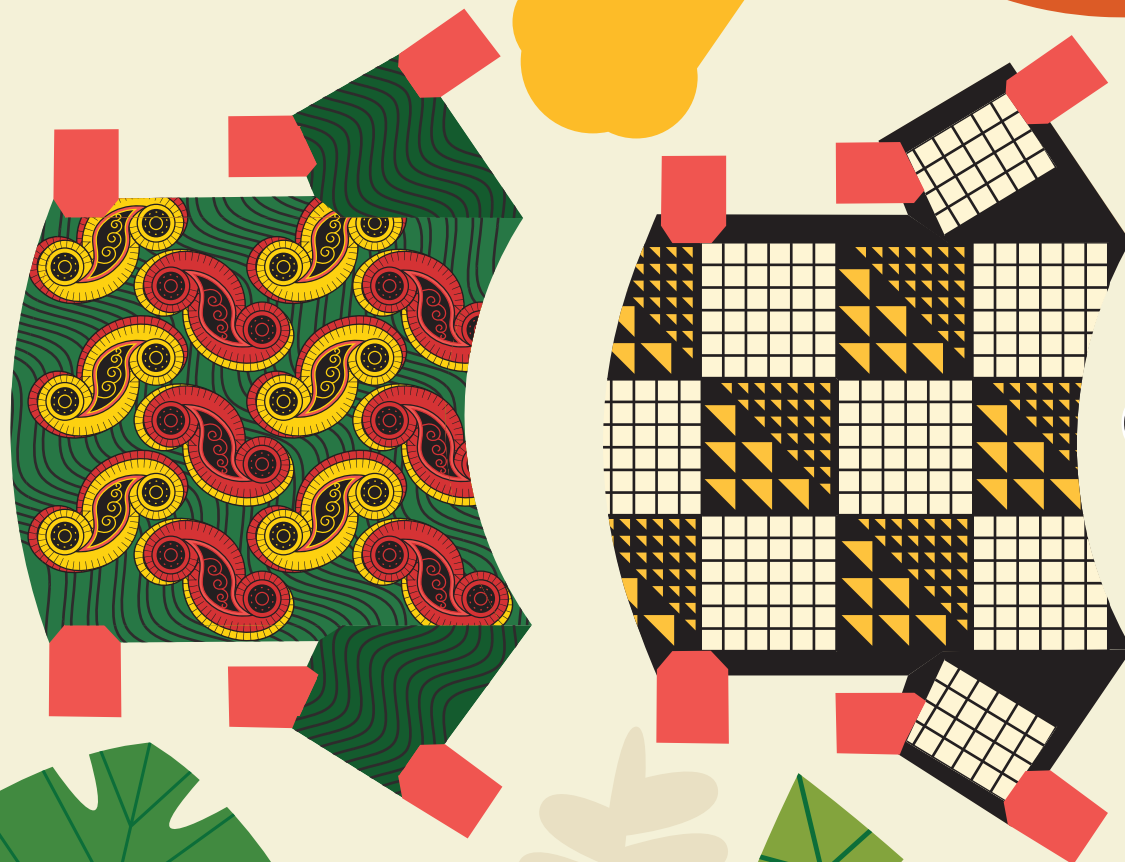


The Lion's New Clothes

A Lion

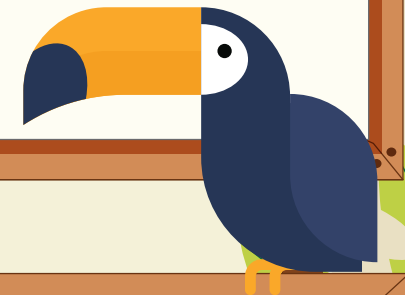


B Shirts

1. Pop out **A** and **B** from the sheet.
2. Choose a shirt, place it over the lion, and secure it by folding down the red tabs.
3. The lion is now happy with his new shirt!

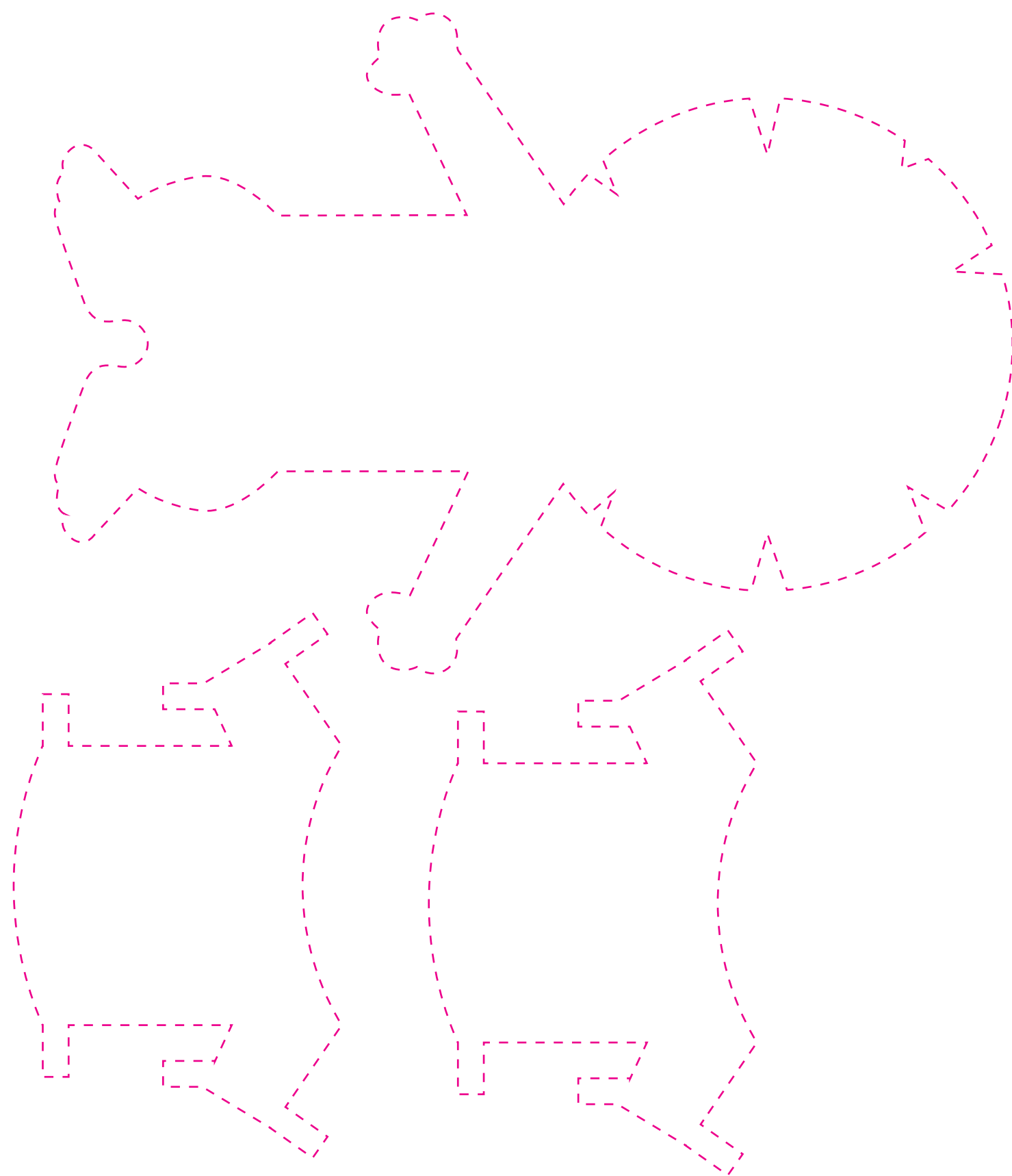


Crafting Tip

On the reverse side of the shirts, draw more patterns to give the lion new looks!

Fun Fact

The art style of *kitenge*, used for the lion's clothes, originates from Africa. The techniques used are very similar to Southeast Asian *batik*! Molten wax is used to draw patterns on cloth, which is then dyed.

Express Yourself with Pak Pandir!

Mix and match different expressions and sarong patterns for *Pak Pandir* the trickster!

1. Pop out **A**, **B**, **C**, and **D** from the sheet.
2. Fold down the red tabs on **B**. Then, insert them into the slits near the top of Pak Pandir's head. He is now wearing his songkok!
3. Carefully insert **C** into the slits of **A1**, making sure that the face of Pak Pandir is covered and replaced by **C**.
4. Pop out the brown sarong piece from **A**. Then, insert **D** into the slits of **A2**, making sure that the sarong patterns can be seen on the bottom wear.
5. Using the pull tabs, have fun changing Pak Pandir's outfit and expression!

Storytelling Tip

Change Pak Pandir's expressions to match his emotions as you tell the story!

Fun Fact

The *songkok* has been part of traditional attire in the Malay community in Southeast Asia since the 13th century! It has since been modified several times for different tastes, styles, and occasions.
