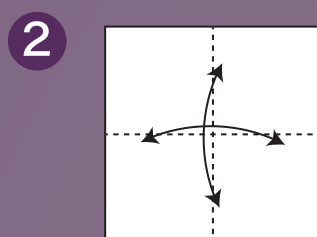


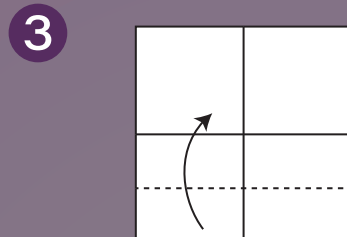
Ribbity Hoppity Hop

Watch your origami frog hop to life as you follow the story of *Pulau Ubin: The Elephant, the Pig, and the Frog*.

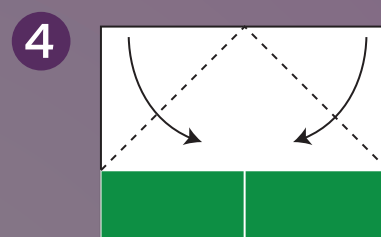
1 Pop out the large green piece. You're going to use it for your origami!



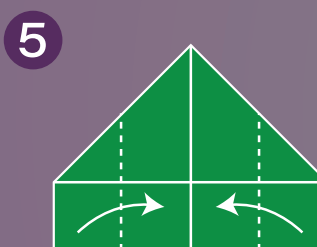
Fold and then unfold your paper, making sure to do this for both sides.



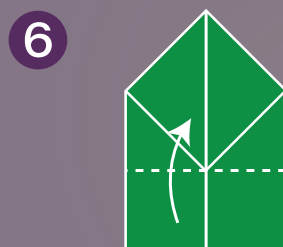
Fold the bottom of the paper upwards such that it touches the centre line.



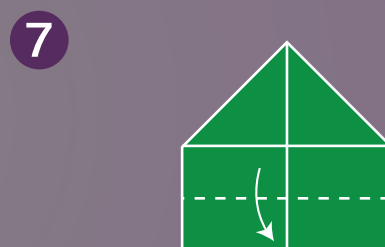
For the top half of the paper, fold the corners down such that they meet in the middle of the paper.



Fold the sides so they meet the centre line.



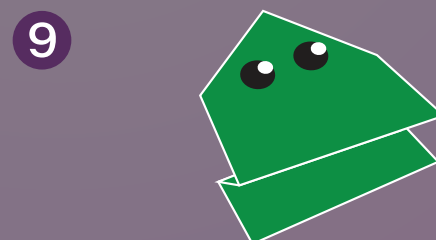
Fold the bottom upwards along the dotted line on the top.



Fold the section you folded in the last step downwards along the dotted line.



Turn the paper over, then give it a pair of eyes with a pen or marker.



Press down on the edge of the back to make it jump. Your frog is ready to start leaping!

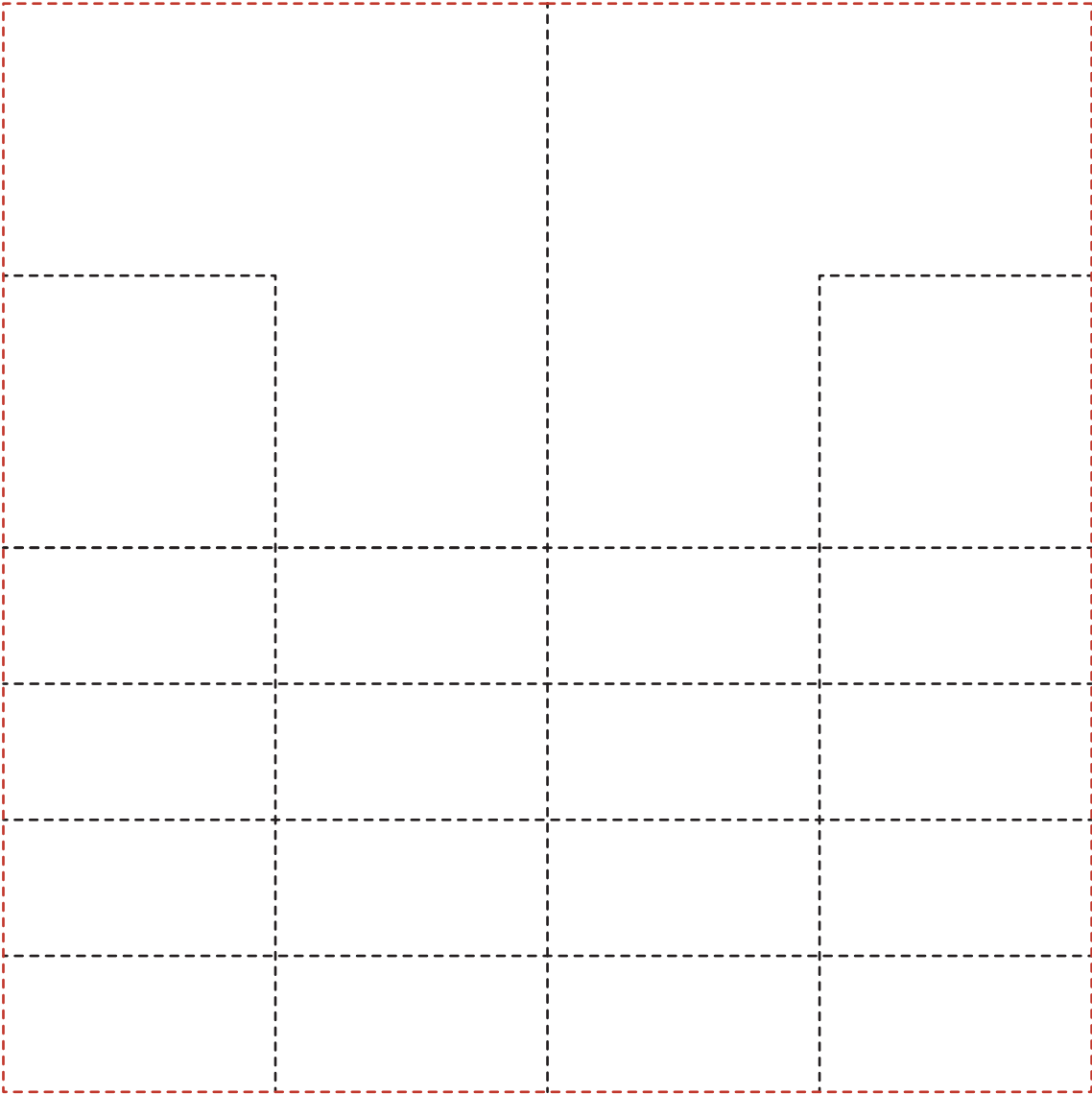
Crafting Tip

Fun Fact

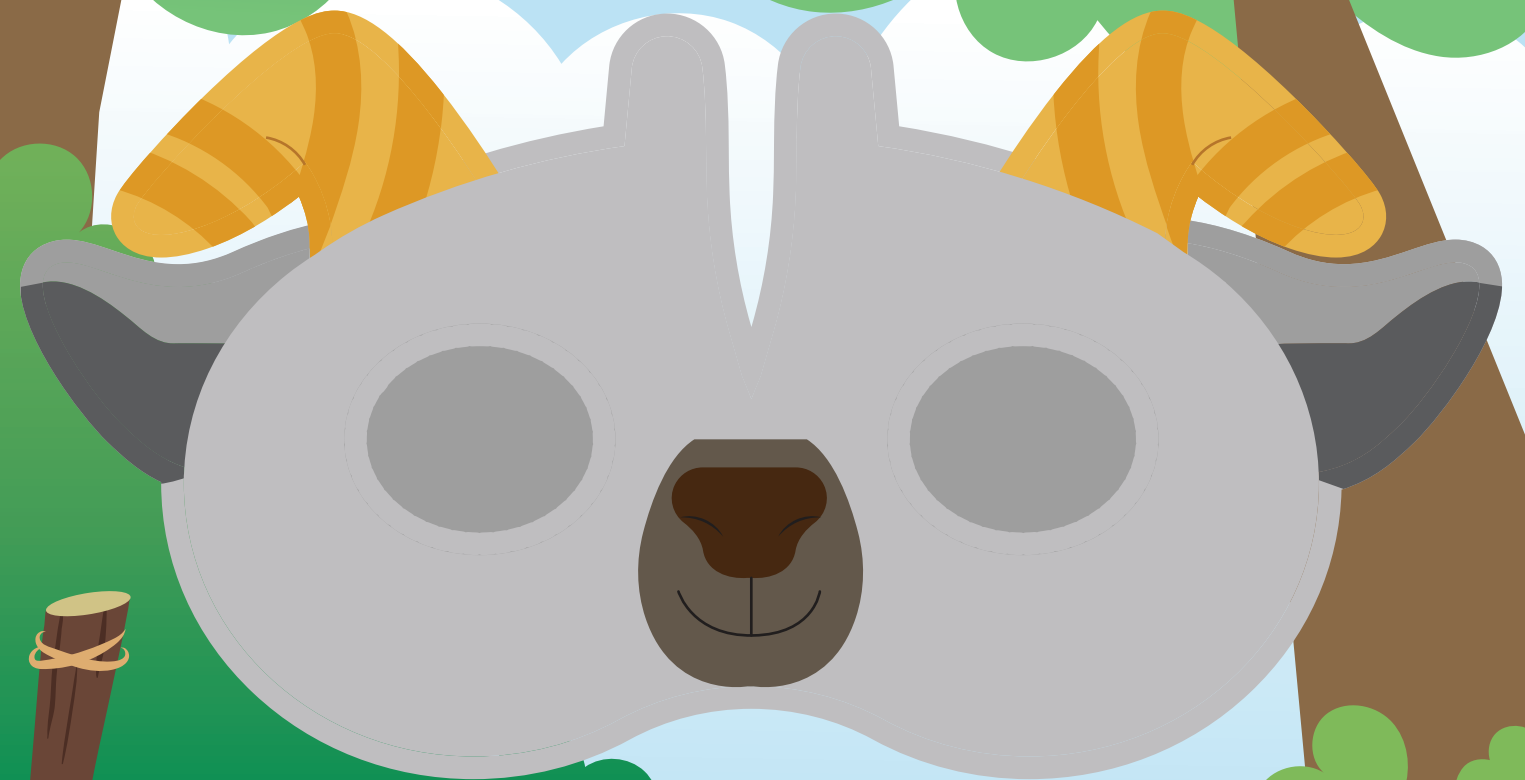
Over 141 bird species can be found on Pulau Ubin. Try spotting the various bird species when you are there!



Baa-squerade Mask

Put on a mask of a goat or the troll from *Three Billy-Goats Gruff*!

1. Pop out the masks from the sheet. Also, remove the pieces in the middle to form the eye holes!
2. Carefully tear along the red perforated lines. The slits will help you keep your mask in shape later on.
3. Now it's time to give the mask a 3D effect so it fits your face better! Use the tabs to secure it and then fold them inwards.
4. Your mask is complete!



Storytelling Tip

When acting out the dialogue of the three goats and the troll, vary how you speak. Try deepening your voice or make it louder when saying out the troll's lines.

Fun Fact

Masks are commonly used in rituals or ceremonies, but they are also worn for protection, in hunting, in sports, or in wars. They also appear in performances and celebrations.
