So you have decided to try creating a story yourself? Excellent! This Storyteller's Handbook will give you all the information you need to write a story of your own.

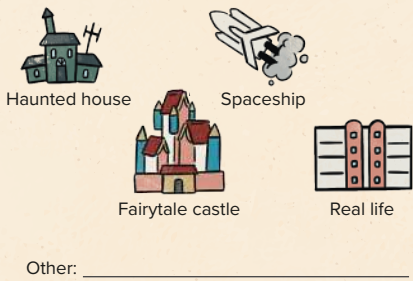

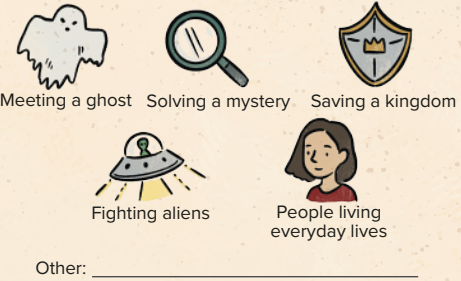

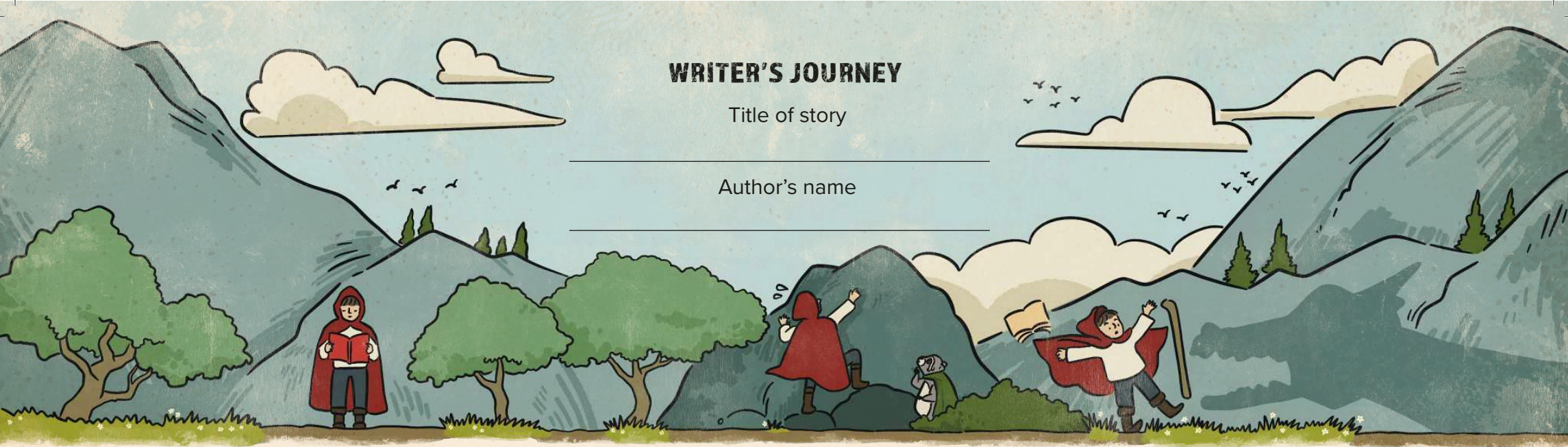
